Proposed upcoming work program – Narrabri Area

Time frames are indicative as schedules are dependent on factors such as approval times, weather and rig availability.

Decommissioning of wells:

- There are no plug and abandon activities planned for January

Workovers:

- There are no workover activities planned for January

Drilling of exploration core holes:

- There are no core hole activities planned for January

Pilot wells:

- Bibblewindi East, Bibblewindi West, Dewhurst South and Tintfield pilot wells are on-line
- Dewhurst North pilot well is off-line for pump maintenance

Leewood:

- There are no construction activities being undertaken at Leewood in January

Other work:

- Wilga Park Power Station remains in operation
