General Business	<ul> <li>Discussion among the CCC about whether gas from the Narrabri Gas Project would supply New South Wales.</li> <li>Member stated that where the gas goes will play a major role in how the project is perceived and the guarantee of supply to NSW would make people more supportive. Also said CCC members needed to satisfy themselves that the gas could be reasonably expected to go to NSW. Santos reiterated that while gas can move all over the place via the connected network, the company recognises NSW needs gas, has an obligation to satisfy the local market and the proposed pipeline runs south to connect into the Moomba Sydney pipeline, not north. Chair summary of discussion: acceptance that while the pipeline system allows gas to move around; Santos has said it will be made available the NSW market; and all options for the local community to benefit need to be explored</li> <li>A member raised the issues of sulphate reducing bacteria, SRB resistant cement and asked for an indication of Santos' plans for the Tooraweenah area. Questions were formally tabled and Information Request Response (Reference 29.2) will be circulated to members via email.</li> <li>Toony Pickard announced he was resigning as the People for the Plains representative on the CCC and that Stuart Murray would be replacing him as the new People for the Plains representative. The Chair acknowledged Tony's contribution the CCC and Tony departed the meeting.</li> <li>Discussion around GISERA's recent meetings in Narrabri (attended by some of the CCC) particularly concerning regulation around gas wells that are no longer required. Concern that there was no one present from Government to discuss long term regulations and monitoring. Chair suggested Santos and the Government should present on plug and abandonment processes at next meeting.</li> </ul>	DRG and STO

	<ul> <li>Member asked if there is a report which tracks which of the Chief Scientist's recommendations have been actioned. Chair to action the circulation of relevant information</li> <li>Chair informed CCC that Nick Butler had resigned from his position within the Department of Planning and Environment and would no longer be a CCC member. Discussion around the need to determine how actions raised at the CCC can be addressed without the Government liaison role being filled</li> <li>Discussion on the proposed administration of the Gas Community Benefit Fund and ensuring Narrabri was well placed benefit from the program. Concern that local groups will have difficulties and lack the capacity to get funding in the future and discussion that the local community must get prepared early to maximise the benefits and ensure it is a "future fund" for the Narrabri community. Chair to follow up with Government to see how plans for the administration and framework of the fund are tracking</li> <li>Member requested information on the capital cost and economic viability of the Project. Santos referred him to the economics chapter of the company's EIS</li> <li>Santos representative provided an update to the group about site rehabilitation progress (Secretariat's summary notes will be circulated at the request of a CCC member)</li> <li>General discussion around the role of the CCC in the future and what the CCC's role would be if the Project goes ahead. Santos representative advised that they would like the CCC to continue. General consensus that while the CCC should be a forum for concerns to be voiced, it should also be a forum for constructive debate, finding solutions and focusing on securing opportunities and benefits for the Narrabri community should the project be approved.</li> <li>There will not be a November CCC meeting with Committee to reconvene for December meeting</li> </ul>	Chair
